



# **Challenging behaviour**

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Thank you to everyone who joined our Family Friday Facebook Live or watched the recording. We hope you found it helpful. Here are some key points from the discussion with Liz:

- Regular communication between families and professionals is key.
- Families are the experts in supporting their young person, but it is important that everyone works together and discusses any difficulties and calming strategies that help.
- These behaviours and strategies may be different in different environments, but consistency of resources and strategies can help to avoid any additional triggers and to enable positive experiences.
- Please feel free to make us aware of any challenges and helpful strategies, or any behaviour plans that are already in place.

Liz can liaise with schools about the challenges your child experiences in the school environment, and the resources and strategies they find helpful to support them; Demelza will try to match or replicate those where possible. Liz is there to ensure that the behaviour support your child receives whilst at Demelza is as tailored and consistent as possible by working together with other professionals involved in your child's care.

Strategies can be adapted to suit your individual child: How do things look for them when they are calm, upset, angry, etc? What do they enjoy? What triggers challenging behaviours? How long do they behave that way? What helps them? What support do they need to recover from these events?

It can be helpful to consider using the same resources in each environment for consistency and to reduce anxiety. Resources such as visual timetables, Now and Next board with visuals, or PECS symbols might be used (and adapted as needed).
